The U-boat did not dive until the range had been closed to 200 yards and the periscope was observed to pass down the port side of VENOMOUS about ten yards away.

Details of Attack: A pattern of five depth charges set to 50 feet was fired by eye when the last feather from the disappearing periscope was passing astern. VENOMOUS and the U-boat were still on approximately parallel courses when the attack was made.

With the last charge there was a much heavier emplosion than normal and a much higher column of water. last charge did not appear to fire shallow.

Decision of U-boat Assessment Committee: From the evidence of the attack this has been assessed as "Probably sunk."
